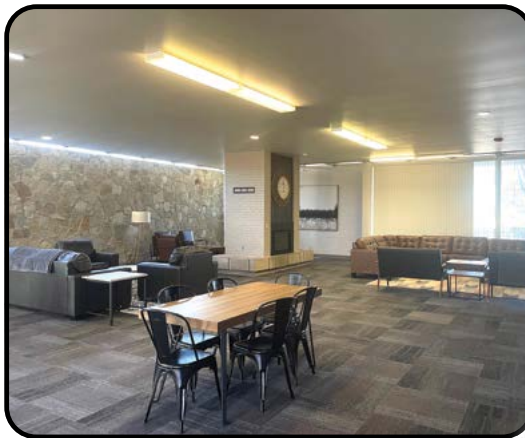

A scholarship application must be completed each year. Scholarship deadlines: Freshmen, May 15; Transfers, July 15; Continuing Students, March 15.

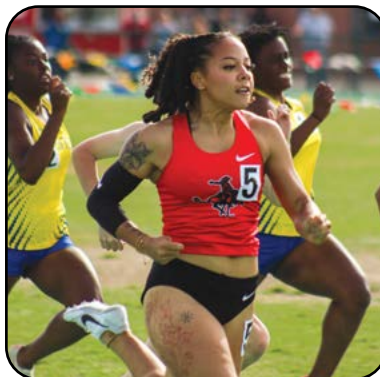

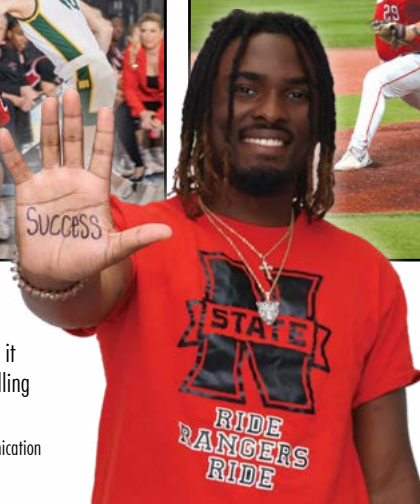

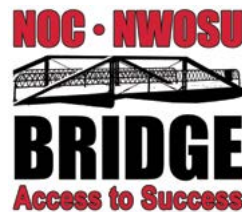
